Parent-Child Interaction Therapy (PCIT) Level 1 Training with CCFH includes:

- A one-day workshop covering: Level 1 guidelines for training within agency, Level 1 materials, implementation of PCIT within agency training model, and challenges and solutions for PCIT integrity and fidelity.
- Monthly consultation calls for one year.
- Faculty review of required video sessions (up to 3).

Trainees are expected to provide their own PCIT 2011 Treatment Protocol and DPICS-IV Clinical Manual. Training complies with PCIT International certification standards.

Level 1 Training

PCIT is an evidence-based, specialized behavior management program designed for families with young children experiencing behavioral and/or emotional difficulties. PCIT teaches caregivers to manage their child's behaviors, while focusing on increasing their positive behaviors. A PCIT therapist works with the child and caregiver together to improve overall behavior and reduce parenting stress. A strong body of research supports the effectiveness of PCIT in the treatment of child disruptive behaviors with growing support for its use with families who have a history of child maltreatment and trauma.

WHY LEVEL 1 TRAINING?

Level 1 Training is helpful for the following reasons:

- Increase PCIT capacity to serve children and families at your agency
- Increase PCIT presence in your community
- Increase your PCIT professional development

TRAINING OUTCOMES

Upon completion participants should be able to:

- Understand Level 1 guidelines for within agency training.
- Demonstrate understanding of how to use Level 1 training materials.
- Understand and execute PCIT within agency training model.
- Articulate challenges and solutions for PCIT integrity and fidelity.

Trainees are strongly encouraged to come to training with a trainee of their own in mind.



REQUIREMENTS

Level 1 training is intended for therapists already certified as a Therapist by PCIT-International.

Participants must have a masters degree or higher in a mental health field and be independently licensed or license eligible as a mental health provider. Additionally, trainees must have completed at least 4 PCIT cases to graduation.

In order to successfully complete training, clinicians must:

- Actively participate during the in-person training,
- Actively participate in at least 80% of consultation calls,
- Submit satisfactory videos for review by faculty, and
- Successfully complete one clinical case to graduation with their trainee as lead therapist while under consultation.

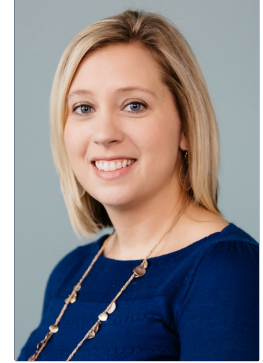
DR. GEORGE AKE, PHD

2019 APPLICATION AND TRAINING TIMELINE

- MAY 20 Application deadline; applications accepted on a rolling basis.
*Acceptance notifications will be issued upon application review and no later than May 31.
If accepted, a non-refundable \$100 deposit is due to CCFH within three weeks to hold your spot.*
- JUNE 10 Full tuition payment is due in full to CCFH. Full cost is \$1,700 per trainee.
- JUNE 21 In-person Training Session: 9:00 am - 5:00 pm in Durham, NC.

PCIT Level 1 training is offered for 6.5 APA-approved CEs (pending APA approval).

Certificates will be emailed with 90 days of the training session. Partial credit will not be offered.
